

his is the original call for entry describing the show "Reflections," a juried invitational exhibition curated by artists Jamie Fingal and Leslie Tucker Jenison. The show will debut at the 2014 International Quilt Festival, Houston in October.

"Consider the following:

A mirror image.

A response to a thought or word.

A memory.

What glints back at us as we gaze upon the water.

The throwing back by a body or surface of light, heat, or sound without absorbing it.

What will your reflection reveal about you?"

"Reflections" is the sixth installment in a series of exhibitions from the Dinner at Eight Artists. The show features the amazing work of 33 artists, seven of whom are represented in this sampling. Each 60" × 24" quilt represents the artist's interpretation of the complex theme. This challenging topic required the artists to look inside themselves to create a deeper, more emotional interpretation of what "Reflections" meant to them.
